Agency History

Prior to 1791 when Pierre Charles L'Enfant was hired to design the city of Washington D.C., the land now known as Capitol Hill was farmland. Many of the neighborhood's first residents were the construction workers hired to build the Capitol. In 1799 the building of the Navy Yard brought in additional jobs and residents. Following the Civil War, the population of the Capitol Hill neighborhood increased steadily as the Federal Government grew and the Navy Yard became the world's largest ordnance producer and engineering research center.

The growth of the Federal Government and its need for building space led to the demolition of many of the original buildings in the Capitol Hill neighborhood. Fortunately, many of the late 19th and early 20th Century buildings, especially the homes, remain. The Capitol Hill Restoration Society (CHRS) story begins with the restoration movement that followed World War II.

The CHRS formed in 1955 as an advocacy group with the goal of preserving the character and architecture of the Capitol Hill neighborhood. Prior to 1955 citizens' associations had existed including the Capitol Hill Southeast Citizens' Association and the Southeast Civic Association. The CHRS, however, filled a specific role as a public forum for residents to promote and protect the predominately residential character of the community. One of the most significant achievements towards this goal was the successful placement of the Capitol Hill neighborhood on the National Register of Historic Places in 1976. Thereafter residents were required to obtain permission to make changes to the exterior of their houses. This ensures that the physical look of the houses reflect the historical integrity of the time period in which they were built.

The CHRS website (<http://www.chrs.org/>) includes the CHRS mission which is a good summary of the type of work done by the organization. The mission is reproduced below. The website also has the most current activities of the CHRS.

- protects Capitol Hill's residential character by challenging threatening and inappropriate development and incursions into the neighborhood by increased cross-town traffic
- helps residents to protect their property values, and offers advice on the maintenance and repair of historic buildings
- tries to ensure that city-wide zoning regulations are applied consistently, in a manner that enhances the neighborhood
- works to improve city services such as tree and park maintenance, street repairs, trash collection, and recycling and engages in community issues like public safety, surplus school disposal, and Ward 6-wide planning
- fights to preserve Eastern Market and neighborhood business districts, and currently tracks plans for the Navy Yard and Southeast Federal Center expansion.
- organizes activities like the annual House and Garden Tour that promote Capitol Hill as a fine residential community.

Scope and Contents Note

The Capitol Hill Restoration Society records were donated in 2000. This donation arrived at George Washington University with an order established by the Society's archives. The Gelman Library processing staff respected the work of this volunteer group and chose not to rearrange the material except when necessary to aid researcher use. The material dates from 1904-1998 with the bulk dates being 1958-1991. The collection consists of 136 boxes or approximately 68 linear ft. and is divided into 16 series. These series can be separated into two broad categories, an office within the organization or subjects and issues. An example of the organization records is Series XIV: Treasurer's Office Records. These records include ledgers from 1962 to 1995 that document the shifting priorities of the organization throughout the years. An example of the second broad category, subjects, is Series II: Barney Circle Freeway Modification Project, which includes reports, correspondence and newspaper articles. The Barney Circle topic is also present in many of the other series.

The duplication of topic is not unusual in the collection and exists for several reasons. First, the collection groups the records of many different members of the organization gathered over time. These members may have worked on the same topic, but in different roles within the organization. Second, many of the topics took years to resolve. The Barney Circle project began with an Environmental Impact Statement in 1982 and was declared officially dead by Eleanor Holmes Norton in 1997. Although this duplication adds to the size of the collection and is perhaps a bit cumbersome for researchers, the George Washington University staff decided the records could retain their original order without unduly burdening the research capability of the collection.

Record Group or Series Descriptions

Series I: Ad Hoc Committees and Task Force

This series is four boxes and covers the dates 1955-1989. The CHRS has many temporary committees and task forces that are formed to respond to a particular project or issue. This series relays the work of several of these task forces. Examples include the Barney Circle Steering Committee, the Prison Task Force, and the Traffic Management Task Force.

Series II: Barney Circle Freeway Modification Project

This series is five boxes and covers the dates 1981-1996. The Barney Circle Freeway Modification Project was a proposed link between Interstate 395 and Interstate 295. The goal was to provide drivers, specifically targeting commuters, with a way to cross the city without using local streets. The project encountered a lot of neighborhood opposition and construction never began. The series is divided into two sub-series including Background Material and Freeway Modification Reports. These sub-series include many of the reports written by the DC Department of Transportation and other groups such as the National Capital Planning Commission.

Series III: Directories

The series is three boxes and covers the years 1968-1992. The series is divided into a sub-series for the finished directories and a sub-series for a sample of Treasurer's records created during the production of the directories.

Series IV: Eastern Market

The series is seven boxes and covers the dates 1971-1991. Eastern Market located at 7th St. and North Carolina Avenue is the only publicly-owned fresh-food market in Washington D.C. The Market's South Hall was built in 1873 and the North Hall followed in 1907. The Market is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. In 1987, the Eastern Market Preservation Development Corporation formed to implement a restoration plan created by the Eastern Market Neighborhood Commission organized by the DC government. Unfortunately, the DC Historic Preservation Office deemed the plan inappropriate and very little preservation work has been completed. Currently the city and the Eastern Market management groups are engaged in litigation to determine who controls the property.

The series is divided into five sub-series including Community Development Corporation, Development Study and Technical Report, Eastern Market Planning Committee, Eastern Market Preservation and Development Corporation (this is still in existence), and General Files. Much of the material within the series deals with renovation issues. Each sub-series includes material that deals with the District government and gives a good sense of the city's work regarding the Market. The sub-

series for the EMPDC is a good set of records for that organization from 1988 through 1991 and includes documents such as correspondence, meeting minutes, and budget.

Series V: Peter Glickert Personal Papers

The series is five boxes and covers the dates 1958-1970. Peter Glickert moved to Washington D.C. in 1951. Following his move to his Capitol Hill home on 11th Street in 1958, he discovered that his house was slated for demolition as part of the construction project involving the Anacostia Freeway. He successfully fought and saved his house. Glickert is an example of a very active resident of Capitol Hill. This small collection relates to his work with several organizations such as the Capitol Hill Community Council, and the Capitol Hill Southeast Citizens' Association. The series is divided between these various organizations and topics such as traffic and Capitol Hill renovation.

Series VI: Graphics

The series is one box and has photographs of various houses and properties in Capitol Hill. It is arranged by address.

Series VII: Historic District Committee

The series is five boxes and covers the dates 1973-1996. The Historic District Committee monitors the exterior design of proposed new construction, building alterations, and demolitions from the standpoint of compatibility with the architectural character of the Capitol Hill Historic District. "Monitors" from the Committee, meet with staff architectural historians at the D.C. Historic Preservation Office to review the proposals, and comment on the proposals before the D.C. Historic Preservation Review Board (HPRB). The Committee also assists concerned community members with making and following up on complaints of construction or demolition being done without proper permits and HPRB review. In addition, the Committee periodically prepares and presents testimony before the D.C. City Council and the HPRB on relevant proposed legislation and regulations.

The series is divided into seven sub-series including Churches, Historic District Committee, Historic Preservation, Historic Research, Legal Documents, Property Surveys, and Schauer Historic District Committee, when Pat Schauer was Chair.

Series VIII: Historical Files

The series is four boxes and covers the dates 1949-1989. This series serves as a catch all for materials that relate to different aspects of CHRS. Some of the files deal with the history of the organization such as those related to the Society's archives while other materials relate to work the CHRS did for a particular project such as the government expansion of the Hine School. This series appears to have been created to serve as a repository for materials that did not otherwise have a home in the collection.

Series IX: Leukhardt Family Papers

The series consists of one box and covers the dates 1904-1965 with the bulk being from 1949-1965. William Henry Yost built his house at 1002 Pennsylvania Ave. in 1894. The house passed to his daughter Elsie and she lived there with her husband John C. Leukhardt until they sold the house to the Capitol Hill Restoration Society in 1979. The Yost House became the headquarters for CHRS. The series has material related to the Capitol Hill neighborhood including a good early history of several prominent residents in 'Only a Few of the Many Fine Historic Places and People on Old Capitol Hill, Southeast' written in 1953 by Elizabeth Draper and the records of the Southeast Citizens' Association and the Washington Housing Authority. The series does not have much material about the Yost or Leukhardt families, but does have historical material about the Capitol Hill neighborhood and about the purchase of the Yost House by the CHRS.

Series X: Gregory New Personal Papers

The series is twenty boxes and covers the years 1964-1981. Like the Peter Glickert Personal Papers Series, this series is an example of the personal papers of a very active citizen. This series has material for many neighborhood organizations that Mr. New worked with including the Capitol East Coalition for Housing, the Capitol East Community Crime Council, the Capitol Hill Community Council, the H. St. Project Area Committee, the Near Northeast Community Improvement Corporation, and the Public Interest Civic Association of Northeast Washington. The series is arranged in alphabetical order by folder headings.

Series XI: Presidents' Papers

The series is twenty-seven boxes and covers the years 1955-1998. From 1955 through 1974 the records are scarce, but after 1974 the records become much more detailed. Each president's term is a separate sub-series and each sub-series is arranged alphabetically by folder heading. Many of the presidents dealt with the same issues and therefore a researcher will find the same subjects discussed in many of the sub-series.

Series XII: Arline Roback Personal Papers

The series is two boxes and covers the period 1950-1983. This series includes the personal papers of Arline Roback, a member of CHRS. The series shows many of the issues Roback worked on during her time with CHRS including Friendship House, Monarch Construction Company scandal, and newspaper articles clipped from local newspapers for the years 1950-1979.

Series XIII: Standing Committees

The series is thirty-three boxes and covers 1965-1986. The series includes the records of the permanent committees of the CHRS. The series does not have records for every committee. Each committee is a Sub-Series and within each sub-series the material is arranged either chronologically such as the Zoning Committee or alphabetically such as the City Planning Committee. The committees represented in the series include Budget, City Planning, Community Relations, Environment, Fine Arts, Landscaping and Beautification, Membership, Programs and Planning, Special Awards, Special Crime, and Zoning.

A CHRS member wrote the following description of the work of the Zoning Committee.

The Zoning Committee monitors the Capitol Hill Historic District and the nearby interest areas for the D.C. Government, Federal Government, and private actions that affect land use. The Committee obtains copies of the Board of Zoning Adjustment (BZA) applications for zoning variances or special exceptions. The Committee investigates the application and then has an open meeting to discuss and gather facts that are pertinent to the application. The Committee announces the CHRS position on the application and this position is sent to the BZA. Often a member of CHRS will attend the BZA hearing and if necessary testify. In addition, zoning variances are investigated and monitored for how CHRS should respond to ensure compliance with the zoning regulation.

Series XIV: Treasurer's Office Records

The series is eleven boxes and covers the years 1962-1995. Each fiscal year is a separate sub-series and within each sub-series the folders are arranged alphabetically. The Treasurer was one of the five original officer positions established when the Society was founded and has responsibility for all financial operations of the Society. Following the purchase of the Yost House the role of the Treasurer expanded to maintain two sets of accounts. The records of the Treasurer are significant for research because they can be analyzed to study a shift in priorities and may reveal a changing focus with the purchase of the Yost House and an expansion of the legal battles.

Series XV: Yost House Committee

The series is two boxes and covers the years 1979-1989. The CHRS purchased the Yost House at 1002 Pennsylvania Avenue in 1979 to serve as the headquarters of the organization. The series has one sub-series of general information related to the purchase and a second sub-series with the RFPs requested as part CHRS's planned renovations for the Yost House.

Series XVI: Oversize Materials

The series is six boxes and covers the years 1962-1980. This series is an artificial series created to have all the oversize boxes at the end of the collection. The series includes the oversize material pulled from the Series V: Peter Glickert Personal Papers and the newspapers found in Series VIII: Historical Files.
